DIALOGUE TOPICS

DAY 1 – 18 September 2026 (Fri)

1. Lifecycle of missionary & member care

Understanding the lifecycle of missionary so we can provide effective member care.

How do we care for the missionaries that the church sends out? How does the church support the missionaries as they enter the mission field, serve over a period of time, and eventually make the re-entry back to Singapore? At each stage of a missionary lifecycle, what are the salient needs? What are the blind spots and pitfalls that we need to be made aware of?

2. Engaging the church for missions

Missions engagement in the church starts with awareness, prayer, education and short-term trips.

How do we engage the church for missions? What platforms are available to share and teach on missions in the churches? Are there different ways of engagement for different segments in the church? What has been effective? What are the challenges in engaging the church for missions?

3. Growing the next generation of missionaries

It is imperative that we build up the next generation of missionaries to carry on the good work of missions in our churches.

How do we excite young people (millennials, Gen Z, Gen Alphas) for missions? How is the approach different from engaging an older generation? What are their passions and what makes them click? What does the church need to do differently? What are some success stories that we can learn together?

4. Missions in the discipleship of the church

The Great Commission is given to all disciples. It is an integral part of every disciple's journey. Missions grow the church.

Is missions compartmentalized as one of the ministries of the church? Is there an understanding that missions form an integral part of our discipleship? How can missions be integrated into the ministry of the Word & prayer of the church? How does the church grow discipleship through missions?
